A memorial service will be held at 2:00 pm Saturday, October 20, 2018 at Goldfinch Funeral Home, Beach Chapel.

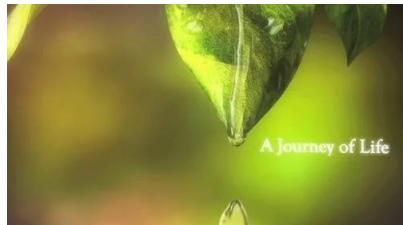
