



## Joseph Franklin Hinterberger

Murrells Inlet Joseph F. Hinterberger died at Roper Hospital in Charleston SC on March 14, 2009, after 88 years of really living. Mr. Hinterberger was born in Elma NY, the son of the late Edwin and Elizabeth Hinterberger. A Major in the US Army and Veteran of World War II, he was involved in the Normandy Invasion, the Battle of the Bulge, and the Red ball Express. He was an active member of St. Michael's Church, the Knights of Columbus, the Telephone Pioneers of America, and the Retired Officers Association. A vocal catalyst for progress, he was involved in the Murrell's Inlet Property Owner's Association, and an early proponent and supporter of the Marshwalk Project. A loving husband of 57 years, he is survived by his devoted wife Patricia Ann Perry Hinterberger. Mr. Hinterberger was the hard-working father of two sons: Frank Hinterberger of Los Angeles, CA and Joseph W. Hinterberger of Watkins Glen, NY; and four living daughters: Raya Soleil Anne Hinterberger of Santa Fe, NM, Elizabeth Hinterberger of Middletown Springs, VT, Kathleen Hayes of Rexford, NY, and Eileen Hinterberger of Ballston Spa, NY. He was recently preceded in death by one daughter, Mary Hinterberger Seaman. He was also the proud grandfather of 18 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He is survived by his brother Charlie, along with many beloved nieces, nephews, cousins, and in-laws. A memorial mass will be held at 10:00 A.M. Friday, March 20, 2009 at St. Michaels Catholic Church with Father Ray Carlo officiating.
