Joyce Jones Motter, 86, passed away September 30, 2020 in Murrells Inlet, SC.

Mrs. Motter, born in Greenville County, was the daughter of the late Grover L. and Juanita H. Jones of Greer, SC, and widow of the late Charles E. Motter, USAF retired.

In June 1952, Joyce Jones met her beloved, 'Chuck', a young airman from Punxsutawney, PA, stationed at nearby Donaldson AFB. Following a whirlwind courtship and a Halloween proposal, the young couple wed on December 20th. She and the love of her life were inseparable for nearly 67 years. Known for excellent cooking skills, she was best loved for her genuine hospitality. Joyce was happiest when her home was filled with guests and tables were laden with home cooked meals. She enjoyed hosting annual neighborhood teas, and soup/dessert luncheons for her community's maintenance crews. 'But be ye doers of the word and not hearers only' certainly applied to Joyce and her servants' heart. Mrs. Motter and her husband were also charter members of First Southern Baptist Church Mountain Home, the first of its kind in Idaho. She will be missed by so many family and friends.

Joyce loved sunshine, the outdoors and had quite the green thumb. She loved starting new plants and sharing them with others. She was fond of her 'redbirds' and will be forever remembered each time family or friends glimpse a beautiful cardinal at their bird feeders.

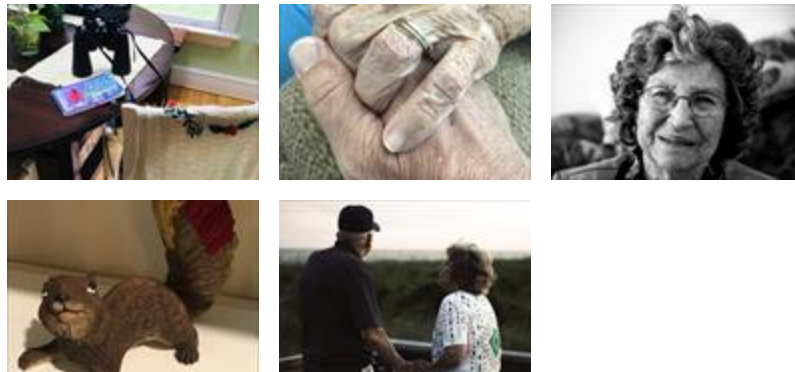
