Pawleys Island June S. Fette June Stella Fette age 77, formerly of Denville, NJ died at her home in Pawleys Island Heritage Plantation on Wednesday, February 11, 2009 after a long struggle with Alzheimer's. Mrs. Fette was born in Passaic, NJ a daughter of the late Frank and Helen Luteran. June spent most of her life in New Jersey attending and graduating Clifton High School, then graduating a few years later from the New York School of Interior Design. She became an accomplished artist in wall glazing and sophisticated faux finishes, having studied and taught at the renowned Isdell O'Niel Institute for the Painted Finish in NYC. In addition to her work in numerous Park Ave NYC apartments, she completed the faux marble work on the six story columns of the Hackensack, NJ Bergen County Court House. Later she was commissioned to redo the antiquing of the chuck wagon for the Marlboro cigarette commercials in Dunango, Colorado. The highlight of her career came when she was called upon to prepare and design the various techniques of finishes that were to be used by Sherwin Williams to produce the Ralph Loren line of interior paints marketed through the Home Depot stores nation-wide. Survivors include her husband, Henry Bud Fette, a retired New Jersey auto dealer and four children, Gary of Myrtle Beach, SC, Jeffrey of Basking Ridge, NJ, Christine and Suzanne both of Atlanta, GA; along with two grandsons, Jeffrey, Jr. and Stephen both of NJ; one brother, Frank of PA. A memorial service will be held at 11:00 A.M. Monday, February 16, 2009 at All Saints Church on Kings River Rd, with Reverend David Ball officiating. A

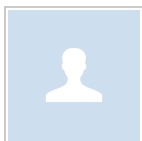
