



## Lanier W. Lawrimore

June 23, 1934 - January 22, 2023

Mr. Lanier W. Lawrimore, 88, husband of Doris Lawrimore, passed away Sunday, January 22, 2023 at his home following a brief illness.

Born June 23, 1934 in Conway, SC, Mr. Lawrimore was the son of the late Roland B. Lawrimore and the late Lumina Clardy Lawrimore. He was beyond avid in his love of deer hunting and enjoyed hunting with friends. Mr. Lawrimore retired from Akzo Nobel after 35 years of service and truly enjoyed his work. He was active in the Shriners and served on the boards of the Girls Club and the Walter State Community College in Morristown, TN. He attended Economy United Methodist Church and First Baptist Church, both in Morristown, TN and later attended Brown Swamp United Methodist Church after moving back to Conway, SC. In his later years Mr. Lawrimore enjoyed feeding the myriad of wildlife that greeted him in his back yard every afternoon.
