Lawrence "Larry" Eugene Rodgers age 72, formerly of Jamestown, New York, died Sunday, June 12, 2011.

Born on September 12, 1938 in Blue Eye PA, he was the son of the late Leonard and Julia Sluga Rodgers. Larry was a graduate of Youngsville, PA High School. He was employed at the Carborundum Plant in Falconer New York for 36 years. Larry's favorite pastime was sports. He was a member of the NYSAC football officials, the Chautaugua baseball and softball umpires association in which he held numerous offices. The Position he enjoyed most was being the rules interpreter for all three. He was one of the officials that worked the first New York State High School football championship game and the first New York State High School baseball championship game. When he retired from officiating football he had worked 610 varsity football games. In 2002, Larry and Janet moved to Murrells Inlet, SC. He was a member of Christ Church and Southstrand Antique Arts Association. He really enjoyed helping a charity known as Help for Kids. Larry was preceded in death by his brother, John Rodgers and an infant daughter.

Survivors include a daughter, Kristal (Mark) Hungate of Kernersville, NC; and a son, Mark (Saira) Rodgers of Acworth, GA; he loved his grandchildren,

MacKenzie Cady Hungate, Christopher Lawrence Hungate and Jacob Garner Rodgers by whom he was referred to as Pa; sisters, Janet (Kenneth) Dininny of Youngsville, PA; Anne (Tom) Cooke of Mechanicsville, MD and a brother, Richard (Marilyn) Rodgers of Warren, PA. He is survived by his High School sweetheart, Janet Wilcox Rodgers that he married on November 24, 1962 in Corry, PA.

A memorial service will be held at 2:00 PM Thursday, June 16, 2011 at Christ Church Prince Creek Parkway, Murrells Inlet with Reverend David Bryan officiating.
