



## Lonnie H. King

Lonnie H. King, age 96, of King Farm Road, died Monday, January 10, 2005 at his residence following an illness. Mr. King was born in the Baker's Chapel Section of Horry County on July 3, 1908, a son of the late Hill and Carrie Baker King. He was a lifetime member of Baker's Chapel Baptist Church where the original fellowship hall was named in his honor for all his years of service to God's work and serving his fellow man. Mr. King served over 50 years as a deacon at Baker's Chapel Baptist Church and sang in the church choir. He graduated from Poplar Grammer School and Conway High School. He farmed over 80 years and was owner and operator of King Saw Mill. Mr. King was employed as a tobacco buyer for a number of years by Hardee Brothers Warehouse in Mullins and by The Big Three Warehouse in Hemingway. He was honored by Horry County by having the road from Highway 319 to Poplar Church Road named the King Farm Road. Mr. King won many ribbons from the S.C. State Fair for his produce and cured tobacco. He is predeceased by his first wife of 49 years, Brittie Todd King which passed away in 1976 , two brothers Moen King and Burgess King and one sister Carolina Hucks. Surviving are his wife of 19 years, Delphia King of Aynor; three daughters, Doris Hodge and her husband Oscar of Aynor, Vera Shaw and her husband Milburn of West Columbia and Sarah McElwee and her husband Bob of Clover, SC; one step-daughter Robin Myers and her husband Shane of Conway; eleven grandchildren, fourteen great-grandchildren, one great-great-grandchild and one step-grandchild. Funeral services will be held

2:00 PM Thursday from Baker's Chapel Baptist Church with Rev. Lamar Squires officiating. Burial will follow in the church cemetery, directed by Goldfinch Funeral Home, Conway Chapel. The family will receive friends from 6-8 PM Wednesday at the funeral home.
