Lonnie Howard Hyman, age 75, of Hwy. 905, died Wednesday, January 31, 2007 at his residence following an extended illness. Mr. Hyman was born in Conway, SC, a son of the late Lonnie B. He was a charter member of the Horry County Board of Health. He was a Mason with the Conway Masonic Lodge # 65 , a Shriner and a member of the V.F.W. He was instrumental in the development of the Conway Swimming Pool, Collins Park and several area boat landings. He served as Deacon, Sunday School Teacher and Superintendent at Langston Baptist Church and at First United Methodist Church. He was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church. Surviving are his loving wife of 56 years, Ann Elizabeth Capps Hyman of Conway, one son, Chip Hyman of Conway, one daughter, Beth Calhoun and her husband, Ken of Conway, one grandson, John Calhoun of Conway, and one niece, Jamie Moss of Conway.
