Louie R. Haynes, 90, husband of Betty J. Haynes, passed away peacefully on Saturday, July 25, 2015 at Tideland's Hospice House in Georgetown.

Mr. Haynes was born in Walnut Ridge, Arkansas, a son of the late Robert and Lorraine Wallin Haynes. In addition to his parents, Mr. Haynes was preceded in death by his first wife; Mildred Edrington Haynes; a son, Gary Haynes; a sister, Helen Cantrell; a grandson, Robert Daniel Peters; and a half brother, Bobby Haynes.

Mr. Haynes was a veteran of the United States Army who served in WWII. He was a Purple Heart recipient, and also received the WWII Victory Medal and the American Theater Service Medal. He was a member of the VFW and also served as a volunteer with the American Red Cross. He worked as a supervisor with Bell & Northfleet, Inc. and retired from the Arnold Trueman Company. His hobbies included fishing, hunting, four-wheeling, and woodworking.

Haynes; his two daughters, Kathy Weaver and her husband, Joey, and Karen Davis and her husband Terry, all of Clinton, AK; his three stepchildren, Barbara Haynes of Myrtle Beach, SC, Bill Haynes of Zionsville, NC, and Barry Haynes and his wife, Shelly, of Pawleys Island, SC; 10 grandchildren; and 18 great grandchildren.
