Maria Angela Ares age 86 died Saturday August 25, 2018 at Tideland's Waccamaw Community Hospital.

Mrs. Ares was born on the Island of Madeira, Portugal on July 11, 1932, a daughter to the late Eduardo and Angela Nobrega. She immigrated to the US in the late 1950's and became a citizen in 1964. Mrs. Ares worked in the airline business in New York City for Pan AM and she opened the first Air Portugal Sales Office in the US on Fifth Avenue and worked with SAS in Queens, NY. She and her husband retired to Heritage Plantation in 1997 where she later volunteered at Waccamaw Community Hospital and the Myrtle Beach Airport. Mrs. Ares was very active with the Heritage Plantation Ladies Luncheon Group.
