Myrtle Beach Marian Louise Barnes Reese, age 78 died Sunday, November 27, 2005 at her home. “ To: Robin, Sam and Bill, Jr.: A letter from a cousin in Johnstown this week brought me the obituary which had the sad news about Marian, who has been a very dear friend of mine since about 1945, when we were students at Junior Pitt, in Johnstown. I sent Marian a birthday card in August, this year, but didn't realize until I shared the obit with my son, and he commented that I was one year and one day old when she was born. Marian wrote to me in Sept. to thank me for the card and to tell me she had been in the hospital. As usual, it was a lovely letter. I am glad I have kept it, and can share part of it with you, for near the end she wrote: "Please do not worry about me; I will be fine. The kids have been wonderful. Sam has been an absolute angel, and Robin and Joe are back from Seattle, and Bill Jr. came down the weekend before Labor Day. I'm in good hands!" Thanks to Bill Jr., we were able to have a brief but very nice visit together here about two years ago. Prior to that, we met once at Chautauqua, and later that day, Bill, Jr. took us for a boat trip on Lake Chautauqua. In 1944, my first year at Jr. Pitt, I triple dated with his dad. We three couples would go together to movies and stop afterwards for a soda. Nothing serious, as those were innocent, wonderful days. We were all new students, just getting used to meeting new people. I went with a fellow named Jack, who was a friend of Bill Reese, and Bill went with Irma Hunt, who many years later became the author of "Dearest Madame" the story of the Presidents' mistresses. Those triple dates lasted less than a year. Shortly after that, I met Bob, who later became my husband, and Marian met Bill. Through letter writing, Marian and I kept in touch after she moved to California. Her cousin, Dorothy Butler and I had known each other through Sunday School classes at Second Presbyterian Church in Johnstown. Once when Dorothy was back from Egypt, visiting, Marian had me up to her home in Westmont for the three of us to get together. I've so many memories of Marian -- all of them good. All of them pleasant. I'd written to her just a few weeks ago and had been looking for a letter from her when I received the sad news. I will miss her very much. As a teenager, she was bubbly, delightful, caring -- and amazingly, she stayed that way. Every bit a lady. My condolences to each of you. Evelyn Klahre
