Born April 1, 1910 in Montclair, NJ, she spent many years in Upper Ridgewood, NJ. She graduated from Goucher College in 1931, married Reinhold Lynen in 1937, and had two children, Sara Lynen Frewing and Richard Lynen. Her husband and daughter predeceased her. Her daughter leaves three girls: Louise Frewing, Katherine Shallenberger, and Leslie Frewing-Runyon, all living in Portland, Oregon. Richard's four daughters are JoAnn Lynen, Susan Hundley, Karen May, and Jenifer Clayborn. She had eight great-grandsons and two great-granddaughters. Her sister, Jean Fleming of Washington, D.C., passed away December 5, 2010 at age 97. While living in Upper Ridgewood, Marjorie sponsored a tennis program for young people and was active in the Upper Ridgewood Community Church. Years later, she and her husband moved to Milledgeville, GA where she served for ten years in various capacities as a volunteer at the state hospital under Dr. I. MacKinnon. When her husband retired, they moved to a home in North Litchfield, SC. There she continued her volunteer service by raising funds for the first paid Pawleys Island fireman (now Midway) and running the clothing exchange at Camp Baskerville. With Col. William Alexander, she worked to establish the Lakes at Litchfield retirement community.
