Marvin Leo Herschberg, 73, of Vero Beach, died on March 7, 2013 at Indian River Medical Center, Vero Beach, FL.

Mr. Herschberg was born in New York, NY and has lived in Vero Beach since August of 2012 coming from Pawley's Island, SC and South Padre Island, TX. He was a graduate of Brooklyn Tech High School and continued on to receive a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Long Island University and a Master's Degree in Social Work from Adelphi University.

Mr. Herschberg worked as a Hospital Administrator for many different hospitals over the years and in many different states, including New York, New Jersey, and California.
