Murrells Inlet Miss Mary Green passed away on July 3, 2006 after a long illness. Born September 10, 1927, she was the youngest daughter of the late Dr. Dove Walter Green and Irene Hardwick Green. She was a graduate of Conway High School and Coker College in Gartsville where she majored in religion, after which she worked as director of religions education and youth work at The Church of Our Savior in Rock Hill. She later held this same position at Grace Church in Charleston, SC. Subsequently, she became a caseworker at the Dept. of Social Services in Charleston and later in Georgetown. While in Charleston, she worked at the Charleston Orphan House, now Carolina Youth Development. While there she realized she wanted to go further with her education in Social Work, so she applied to Smith College in Northhampton, Massachusetts where she graduated in 1961 and worked in Washington, DC in Family Services for three and a half years after which she worked at the Florence Crittenton Home in Washington for three years. She returned to Charleston to work at the Mental Health Dept. as a clinical social worker. After some years there, she worked for the Franklin C. Fetter Family Health Center where she headed up the social work department. In 1976, she became the Executive Director of the Florence Crittenton Programs of South Carolina where she worked until her retirement in 1989. Miss Green was predeceased by sisters, Eunice Green Smith, Virginia Green Legare, brother, Dove Walter "Sonny" Green, Jr. and a niece, Irene Legare Leitch and a great niece, Eunice Green Logan. Surviving are

sisters, Nina Green Wilkes and Melvin Green Nauss; brother in law, T.
