Mary Mishoe Thrailkill, 92, of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, passed away Monday, September 30, 2013 at Covenant Towers Health Care.

Mrs. Thrailkill was born in Conway, SC, a daughter of the late Jeremiah Thurman and Dahlia Baggarly Mishoe. She was a graduate of the University of South Carolina and earned a Master's Degree in Social Work from the University of Chicago. Mrs. Thrailkill worked as a medical social worker for the Veterans Administration for thirty years serving in VA hospitals in Durham and Fayetteville, NC, Washington, DC, and Charleston, SC. She received several Commendation and Appreciation Awards for her work. Since moving to Myrtle Beach in 1998, she has been a member of the First Presbyterian Church, participating in Sunday School and Women's activities.

She is survived by a sister, Johann Mishoe McCrackin (Windell) of Myrtle Beach and several nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her husband, Eugene Frank Thrailkill, and her brother, Philip B. Mishoe.
