Min Alexander, 83, of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, passed away Friday, January 19th, 2024. She was born in Santurce, Puerto Rico and although she left for boarding high school at Stella Niagara in New York state, her love for the island remained at her core, eventually devoting a large part of her career serving her fellow Hispanic Americans. As an undergraduate at Chestnut Hill College, in Philadelphia, she studied sociology, graduating in 1962. She began her career in social services first as a case worker for the Montgomery County Board of Public Assistance in Pennsylvania, then founding and developing the nonprofit, ACLAMO in Norristown, Pennsylvania while simultaneously completing her Master's Degree in Social Work from Bryn Mawr College. In 1979, she was appointed the Director of the Governor's Counsel of the Hispanic Community for the state of Pennsylvania where she served for eight years. Min then redirected her focus to career placement first counseling students at the University of Pennsylvania Law School, then at Lehigh University. She moved to South Carolina in 1993, worked at Wofford College,

then the American Red Cross and then eventually as a Crime Victims Advocate for Horry County Police Department before retiring. She is preceded in death by her husband, Dr. Raymond Alexander and is survived by her children James Collingwood, his wife Fawn, and grandchildren Brynn and Beckett of Downingtown, PA and Karyn Collingwood Markley, her husband John and grandchildren Alison, Claudia, Julia, Natalie and great granddaughter, Harper who will always remember their Abu's spunky sense of humor and fun loving generous personality.
