



## Nancy Gochenour Stiltner

Nancy Gochenour Stiltner, age 73, passed away Sunday, May 13, 2018 at Embrace Hospice in Carolina Forest.

Born January 13, 1945, in Washington, D.C., she was the daughter of the late Karl Luther and Irene Crandall Stine Gochenour. Mrs. Stiltner was a member of First United Methodist Church and was active in mission work, especially for "Help 4 Kids."
