Nicholas Stephen Rittweger, 92, of Myrtle Beach, died Monday, March 2, 2015 at home. He was born in Kearny, NJ.

Nick or "Pops" as some people like to call him, was a retired WW II vet and a 22 year volunteer fireman in Rockaway, NJ, where he rose in ranks to chief of White Meadow Lake Company 5 and then to Department Chief of all five companies in Rockaway Township in 1977. He retired from Resistoflex (Crane) in Roseland, NJ in 1982 and moved permanently to Oceanside Village, where he resided for over 32 years, before he moved in with his daughter and son-in-law.

For years he was active in the VFW and Fleet Reserves. He also volunteered in Oceanside Village. Nick was predeceased by his loving wife of 60 years, Audrey. Surviving are his children; daughter, Lynn Frank of Myrtle Beach and a son, Steve Rittweger of Myrtle Beach; son-in-law, Gary Frank of Myrtle Beach; daughter-in-law, Cindy Rittweger of Myrtle Beach; grandson, Adam Rittweger and two great-grandchildren, all of Richmond, TX.
