Conway.....Col. Normall O. Hudson, U.S. Army Ret., age 83, of Shamrock Dr., died Tuesday, February 28, 2006 at his residence. Col. Hudson was born June 15, 1922 in Centralin, Illinois, a son of the late Herbert and Rea Brown Hudson. He served in the US Army from 1942 until 1964 retiring as a Colonel. He served in Europe, Japan and Saudi Arabia. Col. Hudson was a member of the Army-Navy Country Club in Arlington, VA, the Dunes Golf and Beach Club and the Conway Country Club. After retirement from the Army, he was manager of the National Press Club and the Army-Navy Club in Washington, DC and the Springfield Country Club in Springfield, VA. Col. Hudson was a life member of the Retired Officers Association. He was predeceased by his wife, Lucille Parker Hudson, and two brothers, Bob Hudson and John Hudson. Surviving are one brother, Jack Hudson of Las Vegas, Nevada, brother-in-law, Olin Parker of Athen, GA, nephew, Craig Parker and his wife, Susanna of Manhattan, Kansas, niece, Michelle Hairston and her husband, Charlie of Greenville, NC, companion, Kathleen McMillan and her daughter, Cookie McMillan both of Conway.
