Olin "O.T." T. Clardy, II age 83, of the Peachtree community, died Saturday December 25, 2004 at Waccamaw Community Hospital. Born March 28, 1921, he was a son of the late Authur Milton and Martha Wilson Clardy. He attended schools of Horry County and graduated from Socastee High School in 1938. Mr. Clardy entered the U.S. Army Air Corps on June 24, 1940 , serving During WWII in the Pacific and European Theaters as a radio operator on B-17's and was a Tech SGT when discharged on June 25, 1945.
