Pat was a graduate of South Plainfield HS and Trenton State Teaching

College. She taught Physical education for many years in NJ at Watching Hills, South Plainfield and Somerville middle schools. She was a coach of both gymnastics and cheerleading where her kind words, support, and hugs were always her currency. She was an amazing athlete herself, almost unhittable as a softball pitcher, as well as a cheerleader and an accomplished dancer

Pat's favorite words were, "I want to go to the beach"! You knew she was the happiest when she was on the beach or near the water. She loved to read, tell stories, plant flowers, do creative projects especially making jewelry.

Pat lived in South Plainfield, New Jersey from the time she was born until she moved with her husband to Surfside Beach, South Carolina six years ago.
