Paul Britton, age 68, passed away Thursday, December 24, 2015 at Conway Medical Center.

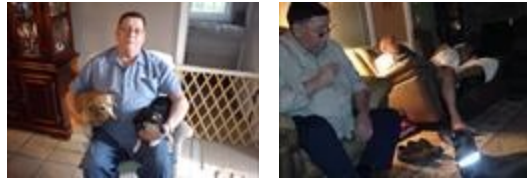
