Paul E. Fowler, age 77, passed away Thursday, October 2, 2014 at Grand Strand Healthcare in Myrtle Beach.

Mr. Fowler was born in Charleston, West Virginia, a son of the late Thelmer C. and Amelia Loriaux Fowler.

He moved to Washington DC as a child where he graduated from Anacostia High School in 1955. Mr. Fowler was a US Air Force retiree who proudly served his country from 1955-1976. During his enlistment he served two tours during Vietnam (1965/66-1968/69) and was also awarded several military decorations. Following his retirement he relocated to Myrtle Beach, SC, where he graduated from Coastal Carolina University in 1980 with a BA in History and was a member of Phi Alpha Theta fraternity. After his graduation, Mr. Fowler received a job in the Coastal Carolina University Library and worked until his retirement in 2006.

Mr. Fowler is survived by; his brother, Bob Fowler of MD; his sister, Betty Burr and her husband, Dan, of VA; his daughter, Yvonne Johnson and her husband, Jess, of Myrtle Beach, SC; his grandsons, John and Wyatt both of Myrtle Beach; and several nieces and nephews of both MD and VA. In addition to his parents Mr. Fowler was preceded in death by; his daughter, Emily Yvette Fowler and a brother, Richard Fowler.
