Raymond M. Jolie age 87 departed this world on Sunday, November 11, 2012.

Mr. Jolie was born in Cleveland, Ohio on April 24, 1925 to Estelle Sepetowski and Walenty Jablonowski who were both Polish immigrants, due to the death of his mother and the difficult economic times of the great depression he was raised by his grandfather, Edwin Munson Elwood. He was educated by the Cleveland School System and graduated from East High School. Mr. Jolie attended Wooster College and earned a Ph. D in Chemistry from Penn State University. He served in World War II in the European Theatre of Operation and rose to the rank of PFC. He was a member of the VFW and a proud American. Mr. Jolie worked for about 25 years in the Research Department of Mobil Oil and rose to become Manager of Lubricant Research. He was privileged to be accompanied in his life by three beautiful and intelligent women, Helen the mother of his children, Elizabeth who raised his children and Sue Feeheley with whom he spend the latter years of his life.

He was fortunate to have fathered six beautiful and loving daughters, Wendy who preceded him in death and her husband, Rich, Kristin (Ed), Judyth (John), Kim, Patricia (Peter) and Barbara. They gave him nine wonderful grandchildren, Katie, Kelsey, Alex, Jessica, Justin, Eileen, Peter, Lauren and

Kurt who served two tours in Iraq and participated in the well known "Siege" under General Petraeus.
