Richard Cantrell Yeary, age 72 of Debordieu died Saturday, March 29, 2008 at his home. He was born on Jan.4th, 1936 in San Francisco, Ca, the son of Alta Jarratt and Singleton Joseph Yeary .He attended school in Nicholasville, Ky., and Darlington Prep school in Rome, Ga. He received a full basketball scholarship at Clemson University in 1954 and played basketball there under coaches Press Maravich and Banks McFadden. While at Clemson he was ranked as one of the top free throw shooters in the nation. After graduation from Clemson he went to work for Cowden Manufacturing in Lexington, Kentucky. He married Elizabeth S. Baker of Charleston, S.C. and had two children, Caroline Hagood and Richard Cantrell Jr.. They were later divorced. He was co- founder and owner of PL.Industries, an international blue jean manufacturer for top national brands including Levi and JC Penney's Arizona. He was an avid golfer and was true fan of sports. He is survived by his son, Richard Cantrell "Chip" Jr. and wife Denise, their two children R.C. and Elizabeth; his Daughter Caroline Bailey, her husband Gray and their two children, Mackey and Hannah-Gray; his sister Jane Simpson; and his loving companion and best friend Annelle Powell. Our visit was simple, casual, loving and special. I am forever grateful that I was able to get from him one more time, what I call a Bear Hug, that is the hug from my dad where I feel so safe and secure. My father looked the best I had seen him in years. So alive, happy and vibrant. That is how I will always remember him. On Tuesday, when it came time to leave, we were planning to go for a quick walk. I asked if he was ready and for probably the first time ever, he said “I think I may pass this time.” He mentioned he really wanted to drive to Florence to see a dear friend of his in the hospital, Johnny Thomasson. Dad had gone to Darlington School and Clemson with Johnny . Johnny had one leg amputated

due to sugar diabetes and most likely he was going to have to have the other leg taken off as well. Dad mentioned he would like to go see him and give him a pep talk to stay alive. I will close by saying a prayer. Dear Lord, please keep my dad safe by your side. I feel comforted in knowing Dad is with you. I also feel his presence with me. Thank you for allowing me to be part of his life and for allowing him to touch so many lives of others. Father, I ask that you take away our tears and replace our sad thoughts with happy ones. I ask this in your name. Amen Thoughts of my Father. He always had a humor about him Always checking on everyone one else to make sure they were ok. Generous A kind heart, very caring, compassionate, and sentimental. The little things meant a lot, for ex; thank you notes. A people person, got along with all walks of life, could get on anyone's level. A Giver, he would much rather give than receive. Always interested in others more than himself. He walked to sort out his problems. Never showed up empty handed. Appreciative A best friend, one you could always confide in. He would never let you down. A true gentleman. 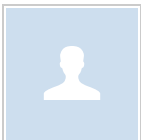

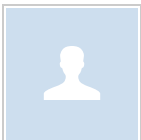
