



## Richard Gregory O'Neill

Myrtle Beach Richard Gregory O'Neill of Myrtle Beach died Wednesday, May 24, 2006 at his home. Born on October 25, 1930 in Greensburg, PA, he was the son of the late Lawrence and Losey Hall O'Neill. He graduated from St. Vincent Preparatory School in Latrobe, PA and attended Carnegie Institute of Technology in Pittsburgh, PA, where he played basketball and was a member of Phi Kappa Fraternity. In 1972, he succeeded his father as president of O'Neill Plumbing and Heating, Inc. of Jeannette, PA. He was a member of the Jeannette Jaycees, Our Lady of Grace Church in Greensburg, PA and was president-elect of the Laurel Mechanical Contractors Associations when he, his wife and several family members moved to the Myrtle Beach area in late 1984. Along with his sons Kevin and Shawn, he established Carolina Cooling and Plumbing, Inc. in early 1985, and was president of that company until they sold the business in 1999. He was active in establishing the Surfside Industrial Park Association. He was a member of St. Michaels Catholic Church in Garden City, and its Knights of Columbus chapter. In addition to enjoying the love of his family, Mr. O'Neill was an avid traveler, bridge player and gardener. He is survived by his loving wife of fifty-five years, Barbara Ann Murrman O'Neill, eight children and twelve grandchildren: Son Richard Gregory O'Neill, Jr. of Troy, MI, his wife Mary and daughters Megan and Catherine O'Neill; Son Kevin V. O'Neill, of Myrtle Beach, his wife Mary Jane and sons Brian and Eric O'Neill; Son Bruce M. O'Neill, of Pittsburgh, PA, his wife Christie and stepchildren David, Jay and Susan Cooper; Son T. Shawn O'Neill, of Myrtle

Beach, his wife Cindy, children Michael, Tara and Christopher O'Neill and stepchildren Bryan, John and Megan Goldston; Daughter Kelly Jean O'Neill-Bagwell of Myrtle Beach, and her husband Mitchell Bagwell; Daughter Mary Beth O'Neill, of Ebensburg PA; Son Dr. Timothy B.
