Conway.... Richard L. Jordan, age 79, passed away Saturday, June 14, 2025.

Mr. Jordan was born in Georgetown, SC, a son of the late Claude Laverne and Mary Magdelene Bradham Jordan. He was a member of First United Methodist Church in Conway and the Hut Bible Class where he was a former Sunday School Teacher. He also served as a former church treasurer..
