



## Robert "Bob" J King

February 17, 1942 - April 29, 2023

Robert "Bob" J. King, 81, of Myrtle Beach, SC, passed away peacefully after a short illness on April 29, 2023. Born in Pittsburgh, PA on February 17, 1942, Bob was the son of the late Ruth and William King, and brother to William (deceased) and Marilyn Scanlon. He is survived by his devoted wife, Edie, and by his loving children Melinda (Robert) Murphy, Elizabeth Skvorak, and Robert Skvorak. He also leaves behind four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren: Meghan (Braden) Myers, Michael (Rachael) Skvorak, Matthew Murphy, Kelly Murphy, Violet Skvorak, and Lincoln Myers, who will all miss him greatly.

Bob's love for education and football began in Charleroi, PA, where he graduated from high school. He then continued on to receive his B.S. from California (PA) State University and M.S. from SUNY Potsdam. Bob exercised his lifelong passion for coaching football as a head coach at both the high school and collegiate levels. He coached at the high school level in the states of NY and PA and at the collegiate level at Hamilton College in Clinton, NY. Bob was honored as Pittsburgh Press Coach of the Year in 1980 and was selected to coach the Pennsylvania "Big 33" All-Star Team in 1981.

After retiring from teaching, Bob's passion moved from the gridiron to the golf course, where he loved to play as often as possible. He also enjoyed coaching his playing partners before, during, and after any given round.

He belonged to the Youghiogheny CC in McKeesport, PA, before joining Prestwick CC in Myrtle Beach, SC.

Bob was a consummate gentleman with a hearty laugh, a penchant for storytelling, and was always a gracious host. He will be dearly missed by all.
