Murrells Inlet Robert "Bobby" M. DeNicola, age 77 of Woodlake Village died Thursday, November 2, 2006 at his home. Born March 9, 1929 in Trenton, NJ, he was the son of the late Antonio and Constance Ranelli DeNicola. Before moving to Murrells Inlet in 1993 where he continued with his music, Bobby was from Pennington, NJ where he was an accomplished musician and a musical instrument repairman. He was also known world wide for his invention of the "Puje" trumpet and his custom made mouth pieces. Mr. DeNicola was preceded in death by his wife, Rosalie and brother, Tony. Surviving are daughters, Linda Hoagland and husband Thomas of Surfside Beach and Terri Baker and husband Mark of Hollywood, FL; grandchildren, Michael Hoagland of Surfside Beach and Jill Hoagland, Boston, Mass. “ I briefly looked through the guestbook before writing this. Wow. Bobby touched so many lives in a positive way. I bought many mouthpieces from him in the past 15 years. Eventually, I asked him for a custom mouthpiece with certain characteristics. What he sent me was nearly universal in how well it worked for both me and my students. I wrote about it in my book, *The Balanced Embouchure*, back in 2001. A couple of years later, Bobby calls, out of the blue. He say, "Man, I'm selling a ton of those mouthpieces. Guys are ordering from Greece, South America, just everywhere. You gotta let me give you something to repay you for the business I'm getting." Honestly, I was just happy that players were discovering his work. I declined his offer, which in hindsight, was a futile gesture. Once Bobby decided that he owed you, his mind could not be changed. "What's right is right," he would say. Of course, he never mentioned all the prototypes through the years that he sent me for free. He never mentioned the ridiculously low prices that he charged for his work. Bobby always gave more than he received. He was unfailingly positive and upbeat, and a great storyteller.
