Robert Vincent Hendriks Jr., 80, passed away peacefully on Tuesday February 18th, 2025.

He was born September 21st, 1944 and adopted by Robert V and Jessie Ward Hendriks of Georgetown SC. He was a graduate of Winyah Highschool and went on to get degrees from NC State, Clemson and Duke Universities.

He was a charter member of the Environmental Protection Agency and worked in the Research Triangle Park, NC as a research engineer for 35 years, developing, evaluating and demonstrating new pollution technology.

He is survived by Shirley, his wife of 56 years, his sons Eric Hendriks, Jeff (Amey) Hendriks and daughter Susan Hendriks, and his grandchildren, Hailey, Brycen, Skylar, Kooper and Wyatt. Also surviving are his brothers David (Terri) and Michael (Gail) Hendriks.

Other than his parents he was pre-deceased by his sister, Martha and brothers Bill and Happy.
