“ To be clear - Robert PC Pelletier was born to Laurier & Rose Caron in Lowell, MA , and following their deaths at an early age, was adopted by Emile and Alma Pelletier.

He is survived by his 5 children: Robert P Pelletier of Groton, Ma; Thomas J Pelletier of Pawleys Island, daughter Patricia A Trombly of Pawleys Island, son Richard E Pelletier of Canterbury, Texas, and daughter Caron Pelletier-Renik of Windham, NH.

He did not serve in World War II (he was 15 when the war ended), nor did he serve in the Korean War - he was stationed in Europe (primarily Germany).

He died on September 13th, not 14th.

By the term 'several grandchildren and great-grandchildren' - is was 12 grandchildren and 22 great-grandchildren.

Prior to her death in March, 2021, he had previously been married to Ruth Pelletier for almost 68 years.
