Pawley's Island Rollie Gatlin Hanna, Jr., age 82, died Sunday, May 14, 2006. Born in Dillon County, South Carolina on March 18, 1924, Rollie was the son of Ellen James Hanna and Rollie Hanna Sr. He is survived by his wife Dorothy Charles Hanna of Pawley's Island; two sons, Rollie Gatlin Hanna III of Richland, Washington and Glenn Edens Hanna of Jacksonville, Florida; two step-children, Elizabeth Charles Ross and her husband William T. Ross, Jr. of State College, Pennsylvania and John Murrell Charles and his wife Libby Gibbs Charles of Charlotte and Litchfield Beach; six grandchildren, four step-grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
