February 2, 1937 - February 6, 2013

Surrounded by those who loved him, Samuel "Bo" Prince, 76, husband of Joyce Johnson Prince, entered Heaven's Gates on February 6, 2013 after bravely fighting Parkinson's disease for 16 years. He was born on February 2, 1937 in Aynor, SC, the son of the late Sam and Ruth Marlow Prince and was a graduate of Aynor High School, Class of '54.

The important things in his life were his relationship with his Lord, his family, his church, his city, and his country. He was a loving and devoted husband, daddy, and PaPa. He loved to fish, camp, and spend time with his grandchildren. He was a member of Jamestown Baptist Church where he devotedly served as Deacon and usher for many years. He served on Conway City Council for 16 years, 3 as Mayor Pro Tem, and loved all aspects of the City of Conway. After 31 years of service, he retired from Conway Post Office as Delivery Supervisor. He served 37 years of military service to his country, 23 years with the Army National Guard and 14 years with the Air Force Reserves, and retired as Master Sergeant. He was a Veteran of Desert Shield/Desert Storm after being activated at age 54. Under Sherriff Teddy Henry, he served as Court Bailiff for Horry County for 5 years. Mr. Prince was predeceased by his parents; Sister, Cora Prince Jackson; Sisters-in-law, Annette Johnson and Linda Hucks; Brother-in-law, Dickie Johnson; Nephew, Jason Hucks; and in-laws, Joe and Wilhelmina Johnson.

He is survived by his wife of 55 years, Joyce Johnson Prince; Four children: Cindy (Cliff) Galloway, Susan (Burman) Jones, Dean Prince, Tim (Candice)

Prince; Grandchildren: Beth (Chad) Tyler, Joshua (Bethany) Smith, Jonathan (Kayla) Smith, Samuel Erik Prince, Nick Prince, Sarah Jones, Renee Prince, Sara Prince, Sam Prince, and one great-grandson, Ben Tyler; Special nieces: Kim Thigpen and Kori Hagerud; Brothers-in-law: Clyde Jackson and Wayne Hucks; and the Johnson family who he claimed as his own: Jimmy (Emma Lou), Tommy (Renee), Gene (Cookie), and many Johnson nieces and nephews.
