Sara Fowler Green, age 80, died May 6, 2006 at her home. Born in Rock Hill, S.C., Feb. 4, 1926 to the late Robert H. and Vera Morris Fowler, Mrs. Green moved at an early age to Columbia, S.C. She graduated from Dreher High School in Columbia and the University of South Carolina where she was a member of Chi Omega Sorority. She studied Art at Columbia University in New York. She taught Art at Columbia College in Columbia S.C. and later Conway High School in Conway, S.C. She married Dove Walter Sonny Green, Jr. who was an attorney in Conway, S.C. She was preceded in death by her husband and her parents. Mrs. Green worked tirelessly in establishing the beauty of the newly founded Coastal Carolina College. Her influence can be seen in the early buildings on the campus. She was a founding member of the Peter Horry Chapter, DAR; a former member of the Magnolia Garden Club, a member of the Riverside Club, a Board Member of the Women's Board of Visitors at the University of South Carolina, Chairman of the Conway Beautification Committee for which she won a National Award; and a member of the Episcopal Church. She was a Girl Scout leader for two Girl Scout troops and a den Mother for a Cub Scout troop. She is survived by a brother, Robert H. Fowler, Jr. and wife, Eunice of Columbia, S.C., two sons: Dove Dunny Walter Green III and wife Vanean; Robert Henry Bob Green and wife, Elizabeth of Murrells Inlet; two daughters: Sara Green Sally Ryan and husband Tony of Greenville, S.C.
