Myrtle Beach Lt. Col. Theodore S. "Ted" Danielsen (USA Ret.) Lt. Col. Theodore S. "Ted" Danielsen age 75, died Friday January 28, 2011 at Palmetto Health Baptist Hospital. Born in Batesburg-Leesville, SC, he was a son of the late Heyward and Helen Danielsen, Sr. Col. Danielsen graduated from Batesburg-Leesville High School and was a 1960 graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point. He received his MBA from Northwest Missouri State University. Col. Danielsen retired from the US Army after 27 years of service. He served two tours of duty in Viet Nam and was the recipient of the Silver Star and three Bronze Stars with Valor. Col. Danielsen was a member at Belin Memorial United Methodist Church where he was a member of the Chancel Choir and taught Sunday school. He was also a member of the VFW. Survivors include his wife of 46 years, Cynthia (Lane) of Myrtle Beach; a daughter Lane Danielsen of Columbia, SC; a son Christopher Danielsen of Baltimore, MD; two brothers Heyward R. (Danny) Danielsen of Lexington, SC, L. Allen Danielsen of Gilbert, SC; step-brothers Lewis Mitchell Jr. of Holden Beach, NC, John Mitchell of Batesburg-Leesville, SC; a step-sister MarBeth Brabham of Valdosta, GA and many nephews and nieces. The family will receive friends Monday, January 31, 2011 from 6:00 – 8:00 at Goldfinch Funeral Home, Beach Chapel. A memorial service will be held at 2:00 pm on Tuesday, February 1, 2011 at Belin Memorial United Methodist Church with the Rev. Dr. B. Mike Alexander officiating. The inurnment will take place at 2:00 pm on Wednesday, February 2, 2011 at Fort Jackson. The family
