Myrtle Beach Thomas A Fiocca Thomas A. Fiocca of Socastee passed Tuesday, May 20, 2008 at Tideland's Hospice House in Georgetown following an illness. Born in Philadelphia, PA, he was the son of the late Louis C. Fiocca of Wildwood, NJ and the late Madeline M. Garrigues Corchiani of St. Augustine, FL. Mr. Fiocca proudly served in the US Air Force over twenty-five years, from October 1965 to November 1991 retiring at the rank of Senior Master Sergeant. At the time of retirement, SMSgt Fiocca, a Vietnam veteran served as the Security Police Superintendent at the Myrtle Beach AFB. During his distinguished Air Force career he was assigned to the Presidential Protection Unit 1974 to 1980 flying with President Nixon, Ford and Carter. Mr. Fiocca was one of the few who traveled with President Nixon on Air Force One for the historic trip to China. Mr. Fiocca was awarded numerous awards with many attached oak leaf clusters, to include the Meritorious Service Medal, AF Commendation medal, AF Outstanding Unit Award, AF Good Conduct Medal with One Silver and Two OLC, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with three devices, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with device, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. Mr. Fiocca served as an Affiliate Faculty member of the American Heart Assoc. and was the CPR Chairman from 1982 until 1991. Tom was also a member of the American Legion. He was proud to be a veteran and in particular proud of his career in law enforcement with the Air Force. Mr. Fiocca, a Charter member of Coastal Carolina Fraternal Order of the Police Lodge 12, served as Vice

President for nine years. Tom continued to work for those still serving in the military and in law enforcement long after he retired. Tom was a man of integrity, honor and trust. He strived to work for those in need and gave selflessly to many more. A truer friend could not be had; he will be terribly missed by so many. Tom was a dedicated and loving Father, Grandfather, Brother and Friend. Surviving are his daughter, Mary Kathryn Fiocca Fisher and husband John of Myrtle Beach; brother, James A. Fiocca of NJ; sister, Madeline Ann Stoltz of St. Augustine, FL; grandchildren, Patrick Thomas Fisher and Elizabeth Kathleen Fisher of Conway. The family will receive friends from 7:00-9:00 PM, Wednesday at Goldfinch Funeral Home, Beach Chapel. A Funeral Mass of Christian burial will be held at 9:30 AM, Thursday at St. Michael's Catholic Church. Burial will follow in Hillcrest Cemetery.
