Timothy C. Taylor, age 76 of Myrtle Trace died Tuesday, April 10, 2007 at Conway Medical Center. Mr. Taylor was born in Los Angeles, CA, the son of Joseph D. Taylor and Carol Taylor Munson, and the step-son of Floyd H. Munson, all deceased. He was a retired engineer from the Aluminum Company of America now Alcoa, Inc. He attended Wayne State University in Detroit, MI and was a 1954 graduate of the United States Naval Academy.
