“ He was truly my cousin Vinnie. His mother was my father's sister and a good friend of my mothers. I never found out what happened to his dad, but his mom lived alone with the two boys. My father took him under his wing and he used to come on weekends to help out and take care of me. Two distinct clear good memories:

We were remodeling the kitchen and my father lathed and plastered over the archway between the front living room and the kitchen. Very early in the morning we were all awakened by a loud noise and some cussing. When we found out " the facts" we sat around laughing until our jaws ached and our ribs hurt. Vinnie had come in very late for his weekend stay and while trying to walk into the kitchen, in the dark quietly, he walked directly into the fresh plaster. He left a very clear nose print in the wall.

In 1945 Vinnie was 14 and I was 9 he took me to a Saturday movie matinee - the movie was the Picture of Dorian Grey. The movie scared me so much that I had nightmares for months. While it seems bad, it became a fun memory as time passed. I talked to Vinnie on the phone sometime after 2005 and it was the first thing he remembered. I regret that I didn't stay in touch with him.
