Vinton Lafayette "V.L." Jordan, age 86, passed away Wednesday, May 7, 2014 at Conway Medical Center.

Mr. Jordan was born in Conway, SC, a son of the late Ernest C. and Dell Causey Jordan. He was a dedicated worker having previously been employed by East Coast Oil Company, Crenshaw Candy Company, Pepsi Cola, and Coca Cola. Mr. Jordan then founded Twilight Shell on the corner of Hwy 501 and Hwy 544 on October 1, 1967 and later became Twilight Towing in 1995. Mr. Jordan enjoyed tending to his garden and traveling to different auctions and farm sales. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by: his son Glenn Jordan; his brother, Elvin Jordan; his sister, Irene Lewis.

Survivors include: his wife of 66 years, Mattie C.
