Virginia Bortner Shull age 92, of Pawleys Island, SC died Monday, April 1, 2013 at Waccamaw Community Hospital.

She was the widow of E. Gates Shull, Jr. who died in 1988 and the daughter of the late Esther Baker Bortner and the late J. Millard Bortner of Spring Grove, PA.

She is survived by two daughters, Tara Chestnut and Hannah Spiehler both of Murrells Inlet, SC; two grandsons, Wade Chestnut of Columbus, Ohio and Todd Spiehler of Murrells Inlet; two great-grandchildren, and a sister, Margaret Becker of Indiana, PA. She was predeceased by a brother, Dr. Richard Bortner of Hanover, PA.

Mrs. Shull attended Western Maryland University and graduated from the Pennsylvania State University. In the early forties, she was a member of the Alumni Council of that university. When residing in York she was an early member of the Young Women's Club, the College Club of York and the Country Club of York. Later while residing in New Jersey and North Carolina Mrs. Shull was active in local politics and in North Carolina was awarded a certificate for "outstanding service to the Republican Party." After returning to York, she was a member of the White Rose Duplicate Club, the Welcome Wagon Alumnae Club and a contributor of articles to the Spring Grove Historical Societies monthly mailings. Mrs. Shull volunteered more than a thousand hours in hospitals, churches, charities and Mobile Meals in several

states.

A graveside service will be held at a later date in York, PA.
