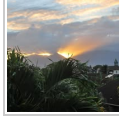

I was a young Airman that was stationed at Myrtle Beach Air Force Base back in the early sixties and got to know CMSGT Bischoff. One day he was driving the Experditer Truck and pulled up to my Air Plane to drop off a Drag Chute. He asked me if i had been stationed at Luke AFB and i said i sure was He then said would you like to go with me back to Luke on a Gunnery Competition i said i sure would so we took about half of the 356 TAC Fighter Squadron Air Planes and Crew Chiefs along with support personnel and went to Luke for the competition which we won. On the way home we lost an AC Generator on the number three engine and had to land at Carswell Air Force in Fort worth Texas. When we got over to the Billeting Office they tried to stick us in and old dorm that had been closed for some time SGT Bischoff said we are not staying in this hole so he asked the Billeting Officer to give us non availability which he denied so Sargent Bischoff said can i use your phone he said help your self. Sargent Bischoff called some General he use to work for and told him what was going on. The General said to let him talk with the Billeting Officer. We got our non availability. We spent three days in the Town House Hotel down town Fort worth drawing twenty five dollars a day per dem which was a lot of money back then . Well what more can you say from then on Sargent Bischoff had no trouble getting some one to go TDY with him When Myrtle Beach Air Force Base closed i bought the Squadron Plake for Match Point That hung in the Trophy room which i have to this day. Over the years i kept seeing Sargernt Bischoff at the 356th Squadron Reunions he all ways seem so glad to see the Old Troops We will miss him. Msgt Clarence W. Smart retired.
