Walter Eugene Treut, age 88 of Woodlake Village died Wednesday, September 22, 2004 at National Healthcare of Garden City. Born November 4, 1915 in Philadelphia, PA, he was the son of the late R. Walter and Mary McElroy Treut. Mr. Treut was a 1933 graduate of Rutherford High School and a 1939 graduate of Duke University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. He was a US Navy Lieutenant serving in World War II as a aviator in the South Pacific. Mr. Trent spent his career in the Engineering Division of the New Jersey Bell Telephone Co., rising to the position of Long-term Planning Engineer, prior to his retirement in 1977 after a 36 year career. He resided with his family in Westfield from 1950-1977 where he served as Coach in the Westfield Boys' Baseball League, a member of the Westfield High School Booster Assoc., a member of the Westfield Tennis Club and member and past president of the Westfield Men's Glee Club. After retiring to Hatteras, NC he moved to Murrells Inlet in 1988. Mr. Treut was preceded in death by his wife, Frouwina Tammes Treut in 1978 and by his friend, Lois McCloskey in 1999. Surviving are sons, William of Westfield, NJ, Robert of Lebanon, NJ, Bruce of Wellesley, MA and Richard of Asbury, NJ; eight grandchildren and his caregiver for the past year, Lee Nichols-Hunn of Myrtle Beach. Services will be private by Goldfinch Funeral Home, Beach Chapel.
