Mr. Warren Schimmel, 85, husband of Florence Schimmel, passed away Thursday, March 12, 2020 at Conway Medical Center.

Born October 18, 1934 in Perth Amboy, NJ, Mr. Schimmel was the son of the late Arthur and Dagmar Schimmel. He was a graduate of Rutgers University, where he earned his B.S. in Mechanical Engineering, and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, where he earned his master's degree, also in Mechanical Engineering. Following a lifelong career in this field with Phillips Medical and other companies, Mr. Schimmel retired and went on to teach mathematics in the public schools of central Connecticut. Mr. Schimmel was a devout Lutheran and served in many capacities at New Life Lutheran Church. He was a life member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and spent countless hours on his favorite hobbies, building model airplanes and electric trains.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Schimmel was predeceased by his great-granddaughter, Athena, and his brothers, Ralph Schimmel, Roger Schimmel, and Owen Schimmel.
