Conway.....Webster Elmer Lineback, age 86, loving father and grandfather, went to be with the Lord on November 22, 2007. He passed away following an illness at Kingston Nursing Center in Conway. Mr. Lineback was born in Winston-Salem, North Carolina and was a son of the late Garney Elmer and Della Catherine Lineback. Mr. Lineback grew up in Winston-Salem. As a Moravian, he spent many years playing in the band at his home church and with his family each Easter. Mr. Lineback was a wonderful trombone player and had a passion for music. He graduated from N.C. State with a degree in Chemical Engineering. While attending college, Mr. Lineback played football for the Wolfpack. He proudly served several tours in the US Army as a forward observer during WWII and was stationed in Europe. He married the love of his life, Miki, on October 28, 1950. Their life together began with continued service to the United States through government work that took them to Japan, Washington, DC, and South Carolina. After moving to South Carolina, Mr. Lineback received his certification as a Professional Engineer. He retired from the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control as a professional chemical engineer after many years of service. He was most recently a member of Trinity United Methodist Church in North Myrtle Beach. He served his community as a member of the Lions Club in Columbia and as a member of the Professional Engineer's Society. He also taught Sunday School and served the church in many capacities. His retirement years were spent living at the beach. He remained interested in preserving the

environment and beaches. In his younger years, he loved hunting with his son and horseback riding with his daughter. He was predeceased by his wife, Mildred "Miki" Lineback. He is survived by a son, Dr. Brad Lineback, and his wife Christy, a daughter, Laura Fowler, and her husband Russell, five grandchildren, Hunter Brazell Lineback, Keenan Christine Lineback, Logan Wade Fowler, Ashton Leigh Fowler, and Reagan Glynn Fowler. He is also survived by his brother, Bill Lineback, and two sisters, Margie Kane, and Kate Nobles. A memorial service will be held 11:00 AM Tuesday, November 27, 2007 at Trinity United Methodist Church in North Myrtle Beach with the Rev. Tim Brown officiating.
