gathering will be held at the house.

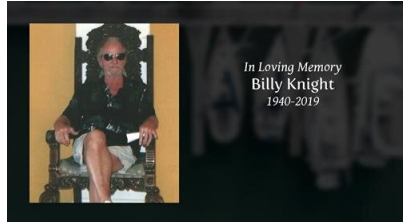
