William J. Walker, age 85 formerly of Barboursville, WV died Wednesday, August 3, 2005. Born August 24, 1919 in Huntington, WV, he was the son of the late Ed and Marinda Sheley Walker. Mr. Walker was a First Sergeant in the US Army, 30th Infantry serving in World War II in the Normandy invasion and European theatre. After retiring to the area in 1985, he had worked at Huntington Beach State Park. Mr. Walker was a charter member of Surfside Christian Church where he had been an elder and Sunday School teacher.
