W.E. "Ed" Thompson, age 78, passed away Thursday, November 25, 2021 at his home.

Born December 12, 1942 in Horry County, he was the son of the late Willie Roscoe Thompson and Mitchell Carter Thompson. Mr. Thompson was a graduate of Conway High School Class of 1960. Following graduation, he honorably served his country in the United States Army during the Vietnam era.

Mr. Thompson was a member of The American Legion, the Conway Masonic Lodge #65 A.F.M., and Litchfield Camp 132, SCV. He retired honorably from the South Carolina Highway Patrol.
